2023 Highlights



PATIENT CARE

Over the course of 2023, Grandview Medical Center played a vital role helping people get well and live healthier at more than 648,000 patient encounters across its hospital and growing network of Grandview Medical Group physician clinics and other outpatient sites of care.

UNCOMPENSATED CARE

We provided more than \$187 million in charity and uncompensated care for the community's most vulnerable and have resources to help them secure medications and medical support devices.

• ADDRESSING SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH

Through financial donations and acts of service, we support the work of local charitable and community organizations including Bundles of Hope Diaper Bank, M-Power Ministries and the Community Food Bank of Central Alabama. Our annual Jars of Love drive collects jars of peanut and other nut butters for local food banks.

GROWING FUTURE PROVIDERS

Grandview serves as the teaching hospital for Brookwood Baptist Health Graduate Medical Education, training approximately 100 residents in the Internal Medicine, Transitional Year, Diagnostic Radiology, and General Surgery programs.

Grandview also works with 24 undergraduate nursing academic programs across the state, hosting more than 300 senior nursing preceptor students and over 105 different nursing clinical groups.

Since 2016, the hospital has collaborated with Hoover City Schools and Riverchase Career Connection Center (RC3) to serve as a clinical rotation site for graduating high school seniors.

GROWING ACCESS TO ER CARE

In 2023, there were more than 54,000 ER patient visits. Grandview opened the first Freestanding Emergency Department in Trussville and filed a Certificate of Need for a new Freestanding Emergency Department in Hoover. A 10-bed expansion of the hospital Emergency Department is planned in 2024.

GROWING SERVICES

In July, Grandview opened a fifth EP Lab. The hospital continues to expand its thoracic program adding advanced technology for lung biopsy that allows physicians to obtain tissue samples from deep within the lung.

GROWING CAPACITY AND SERVICES

Grandview's Outpatient Surgery Center opened in Physicians Plaza II and includes four operating rooms, and the Grandview Endoscopy Center expanded to eight rooms. Two orthopedic surgeons were recruited, and a robotic-assisted joint replacement system was installed.
