2024 Highlights

PATIENT CARE

Over the course of 2024, Lower Keys Medical Center played a vital role helping people get well and live healthier at more than 134,000 patient encounters across its hospital, physician clinics and other sites of care.

UNCOMPENSATED CARE

We provided more than \$54 million in charity and uncompensated care for the community's most vulnerable and have resources to help them secure medications and medical support devices.

QUALITY EMERGENCY CARE

Our emergency department delivered medically necessary, life-saving care at more than 23,000 visits in 2024, regardless of the individual's ability to pay.

ADDRESSING SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH

Through financial donations and acts of service, we support local charitable and community organizations, including Monroe Association for ReMARCable Citizens, Samuel's House, Special Olympics Florida, and SOS Foundation Stock Island Food Pantry.

ADVANCING CARDIOLOGY SERVICES

Our investment in renovations and equipment for the cardiac catheterization lab allows us to offer a higher level of care. With our recruitment of interventional cardiologists we can offer 24/7 care for people experiencing heart attacks. Since expanding our heart program to round the clock, we've reduced the number of transfers for heart care from an average of 20 per month to an average of just seven per month.

INCREASING ACCESS TO ORTHOPEDIC, OB/GYN, UROGYNECOLOGY, PULMONOLOGY & PRIMARY CARE

In 2024, the hospital recruited 10 physicians to expand primary care and specialty services and *Keep Care in the Keys*. Our three primary care locations support patient access and convenience.

GROWING FUTURE PROVIDERS

Our support for the future healthcare workforce includes training the next generation of medical professionals through a New Graduate RN mentorship program, a \$100,000 donation to the College of the Florida Keys for their nursing education program, and two scholarships offered to Key West High School students.





ADVANCING CARDIOLOGY SERVICES
